



Radha Ramaswami Basu has over 30 years' experience in executive management and is widely recognized as a leading woman technology entrepreneur and mentor, and as a pioneer in the Indian software business. Radha grew Hewlett Packard's electronic software division into a \$1.2

billion business. She then held the position of Chairman & CEO of Support.com, a Nasdaq-listed company, which she led through initial and secondary public offerings. Afterwards, Radha and her husband launched [Anudip Foundation](#) to generate livelihoods for India's unemployed and marginalized youth through IT training.

Radha started iMerit in 2012, a social enterprise in human empowered computing that delivers on demand digital services to global clients employing some of the young men and women trained by Anudip. This unique model is being recognized as the 'Future of work' for marginalized youth and young women.

She has received the UN Women-ITU Gender-Equality Mainstreaming Technology Award, Top 25 Women of the Web, Silicon Valley Business Journal Women of Influence Award, and CEO of the Year. Radha founded the Frugal Innovation Lab at Santa Clara University and has been Regis and Dianne McKenna Professor of Engineering. She serves on the boards of NetHope, Jhumki Basu Foundation, and Santa Clara Miller Center for Social Entrepreneurship.
